

District 7 Report

Since its formation in the late 60's, District 7 (San Diego County) of the California State Old Time Fiddlers Association (D7) has held monthly gatherings in the El Cajon area. While this tradition continues, through the help and determination of CSOTFA Board Member, Avery Ellisman, D7 inaugurated a new meeting in the north coastal community of Encinitas. Hosted at the North County Hub on the Leichtag Foundation property, nearly fifty acoustic musicians, friends and family gathered on Sunday, Dec. 6th, to play fiddle tunes at this new venue. The gathering enjoyed the support and help of Tarbuton, which offers collaborates with partner organizations in the North County Hub to produce special programs on the Leichtag Property. "We started the afternoon with Avery and a former Israeli band mate giving a joint presentation (Avery at the facility, and his friend via Skype in Israel)," explained Jennie Starr, Tarbuton's Director. "Israel is known to be a vibrant, start up nation, with an incredible mix of cultures and its music and arts reflect those influences. Hearing first-hand about a thriving bluegrass music community in Israel was a unique addition for all of us. The incredible, spontaneous, and personal acoustic music that flowed out of our own San Diego community immediately after was moving beyond words."

While there were a few D7 stalwarts at the event, it was the first such gathering for the majority of attendees. "At first, our numbers were small, but folks kept trickling in and, in the end we had quite a few fiddlers, guitarists, mandolin players and old-time banjo pickers. We even enjoyed the participation of a young and exceptionally tasteful accordionist," notes Avery. "Instruments were quite diverse, but our common denominator was the playing of fiddle tunes. As it turned out, there were many fiddle everyone knew. We attracted many more people than we expected," he said. Nat Copeland, a young fiddler, resident of Julian, CA, said it was "one of the best jams" he's ever attended. For his part, Ellisman hopes a fiddle-tune gathering in Encinitas will become a regular D7 monthly event – something that will provide cultural richness and opportunity not only for those living in or near Encinitas, but for the surrounding community as well.


